A Lifetime Standing in Labor's Front Lines

Battling for the cause of labor has never been an easy road, no matter where in the world it has been waged.

Here in the United States the cause of labor has, it's fair to say, never had a day off.

And that includes Labor Day.

There are forces afoot, and they have been stomping around since day one of the republic, that view labor as simply that, and nothing more.

The human beings who stand in the ranks of labor, and its representative movement, are seen by some as mere details in a world where profit is paramount.

Now there is nothing wrong with profit per se. But how it is achieved, and at what cost to the workers who generate it, has been never less than a primary concern of the labor movement, and the leaders of the labor movement.

Terry O'Sullivan is ranked among those leaders.

Terry would be the first to say that being the leader of a union in the first quarter of the 21st century is not a task for the faint hearted.

Unions and union membership have been under pressure these past couple of decades.

But in recent days came some remarkable news.

According to reports, and this particular one was carried by The Hill newspaper, public support for unions is climbing.

Stated the report in part: "Seventyone percent of Americans indicated support for labor unions in a Gallup poll released on Tuesday, the highest percentage since 1965.

"The latest measure is a slight uptick from the 68 percent who supported labor unions when the survey giant polled the question last year.

"Gallup has tracked union approval for decades, and support has gradually increased since 2009.

"Support fell below 50 percent for the only time in 2009, but ever since has been improving to levels now not seen in more than a half century. The increased support comes as workers at many major companies have pursued union campaigns.

"A Starbucks store in Buffalo, N.Y., became the company's first U.S. location to unionize in December, and more than 200 stores have since successfully held votes to join the union. Starbucks has battled many of those unionization efforts in court.

"In April, workers at one of Amazon's New York City facilities voted to become the first of the ecommerce giant's U.S. locations to unionize.

"Additionally, the first U.S. Chipotle store voted to unionize last

Thursday in Lansing, Mich.

"The new poll found that 6 percent of U.S. adults report that they are a union member, and 16 percent live in a household in which at least one resident is part of a union.

"The results remain in line with Gallup's range of between 14 percent and 21 percent of adults since 2001 who have said they live in a household with at least one union member.

"The Gallup poll was conducted between Aug. 1 and 23 through a random phone sample of 1,006 U.S. adults. The sample is weighted to match national demographics, and the margin of error is 4 percentage points."

So, some good news. But, for sure, no reason to be complacent.

Complacency is not a word in Terry O'Sullivan's lexicon.

He is a student of labor history. He knows all about historical ebbs and flows.

Part of the ebb and flow has been the relationship that links the labor movement in Ireland and the United States

The Atlantic has been a conduit for ideas, inspiration and mutual support in all the years that the Irish have crossed it in search of a new life in the new world.

Much of the thinking that propels the labor movement in America can

be traced back eastwards across the ocean to labor leaders in Ireland, and labor leaders who left Ireland for the growing United States.

James Connolly comes to particular mind.

Scottish-born Connolly was, of course, a labor champion who brought his message to America before he became a leader of the 1916 Rising. He paid for his patriotism with his life. But his legacy lives on.

And it lives on in the heart and mind of Terry O'Sullivan.

It was with that in mind that James Connolly House in West Belfast, Áras Uí Chonghaile, dedicated its widely acclaimed conference space to Terry, the person who is also General President of LiUNA!.

A long-standing friend and supporter of Áras Uí Chonghaile, Terry and LiUNA have helped ensure that the vision of the James Connolly Visitor Centre is realized and that visitors to West Belfast from across the world are introduced to the life, times and politics of the revolutionary figure and pioneering trade unionist that is James Connolly.

Fáilte Feirste Thiar (West Belfast) Director, Harry Connolly, said of the dedication earlier this year: "We are delighted to rename the Terry O'Sullivan LiUNA! Conference and Event Space in recognition of the immense contribution made to the success of Áras Uí Chonghaile by Terry and his union brothers and sisters from LiUNA!

"It's symbolic of the transatlantic relationships forged by James Connolly over a century ago and we are incredibly proud to continue to sustain and develop those relationships today."

Terry responded: "On behalf of the almost 520,000 proud, strong and united men and women of LiUNA! Can I say how proud, honored and humbled we are to have this space named after our organization.

"James Connolly said it best: 'The cause of labour is the cause of Ireland and the cause of Ireland is the cause of labour.' No truer words have ever been spoken."

Belfast Lord Mayor, Tina Black, commended the support that Terry has shown and all that the James Connolly Visitor Centre has brought to the city:

'We are now a world class tourist destination. People are coming to West Belfast to learn about our culture, history, language and music. The James Connolly Visitor Centre has set the standard. Thank you to Terry and LiUNA! for helping to make the vision a reality."

It's fair to say that Terry, who was born in San Francisco, has found a second hometown in Belfast.

It's fair to say that Belfast has found a new favorite son in Terry.

The cause of labor never rests. Labor faces new challenges each and every day, and sometimes old challenges come back to haunt.

Long may it resonate.



IRISH LABOR LEADER OF THE YEAR 2022

Terry O'Sullivan

General President Laborers' International Union of North America

Terry O'Sullivan became the tenth General President of the Laborers' International Union of North America (LIUNA) on January 1, 2000, and was unanimously reelected to his fifth full term at the union's 26th International Convention in 2021.

The grandson and great-grandson of Irish immigrants, Terry O'Sullivan is deeply proud of his heritage, holds dual American and Irish citizenship, and remains connected to his ancestral homeland. His father's parents were born in Glencar, County Kerry, which saw some of the fiercest fighting in the Irish War for Independence, and whose residents were subjected to some of the most brutal atroci-

ties of the so-called Black and Tans, British recruits of the Royal Irish Constabulary. One of O'Sullivan's maternal great-grandfathers was born in Ross-Gray, County Tipperary, and many of his ancestors fought for Irish independence.

Terry O'Sullivan believes that James Connolly's declaration that "the cause of labour is the cause of Ireland, the cause of Ireland is the cause of labour," is truer in today's global economy than it has ever been. With workers in the United States and Ireland fighting many of the same battles, and facing many of the same issues, O'Sullivan has taken a leadership role in building bridges between the Irish and American trade union movements. He travels to Ireland frequently to meet with labor leaders and elected officials there, and has hosted similar meetings on this side of the Atlantic. In 2016, he led an American labor delegation to Dublin for the official celebration of the cen-

tennial of the 1916 Easter Rising, and in 2019 he led a similar delegation to Belfast for the dedication of the James Connolly Visitor Centre, a museum and cultural center located on the Falls Road in West Belfast. Terry O'Sullivan also serves as President of New York Friends of Ireland, and Chairman of DC Friends of Ireland.

O'Sullivan and LiUNA are well-recognized forces in Washington, DC, working with anyone they can, and fighting everyone they must, regardless of party affiliation, to advance the interests of LIUNA members and of all work-

ing men and women. Under his leadership, LiUNA's Political Action Committee (PAC) has become one of the top PACs in the United States, supporting pro-labor, proenergy, and pro-infrastructure Democrats, Republicans, and Independents. He also led delegates to the union's 2006 Convention to vote to contribute 25 cents for every hour worked by a Laborer to LiUNA's organizing efforts, generating more than \$90 million per year; more than almost any other union in North America.

A fiery orator who is never afraid to speak his mind, Terry O'Sullivan can rally and inspire a crowd of Laborers one moment, then meet with top corporate leaders the next. He is equally at home on a construction site as he is in a boardroom.

Prior to becoming General President, Terry O'Sullivan served as LiUNA Vice President, Mid-Atlantic Regional Manager, and Assistant to the General President. Before that, he served LiUNA in many positions, including Chief of Staff; Staff Assistant to the General President; Administrator of the LiUNA Tri-Funds; Assistant Director of the LIUNA Construction, Maintenance, and Service Trades Department; and Administrator of the West Virginia Laborers' Training Center. A proud native of San Francisco, California, he joined LIUNA in 1974, and is a long-time member of LiUNA Local Union 1353 in Charleston, West Virginia.

What changes do you think the labor movement could improve on, in today's economy? The unions must realize that they face strong competition from non-union labor willing to work for less. Their approach should be two-fold;


- 1. Relax onerous work rules which can hamper productivity.



What changes do you think the labor movement could improve on, in today's economy? The labor movement should mirror the cities and towns where we work. An honest attempt should be made to recruit




people from neighborhoods where we are working and have them apply to our apprenticeship programs.

Labor was 'part of who we were'

"Our working conditions are the children's learning conditions."

So said Kara McCormick-Lyons, president of the White Plains Teachers Association.

That's why the 7th grade English teacher when checking in with about working conditions, and to ensure they're being taken care of, and when talking with management, must also have the students' needs at the forefront of her mind.

McCormick-Lyons has additional union role as a vicepresident of the Union of Federation of Teachers. "So I spend a lot of time tuned in nationally, regarding education and labor and public policy," she said.

Of her full-time job, the Croton resident McCormick-Lyons said, "We teach the students to become critical thinkers; we don't teach them what to think, but we sure teach them how to think. Literature is the pathway here that I've chosen

The students have a lot of choice in terms of what they can read and are allowed to gravitate towards what they're curious about. "So we focus on skills," she said.

"They are encouraged to investigate topics they're interested in," Kara McCormick-Lyons said of the students. "We all are scholars if we choose to be. We encourage them to think of themselves as scholars."

As might be expected of an English teacher, her background was crucial in shaping her. "Growing up in my house, my dad, though he wasn't college educated, was an avid reader and ensured that my brother and I were avid readers. He took such pride in the literary tradition of Ireland.

'He'd love to talk about Bram Stoker," McCormick-Lyons recalled, citing an example, and added that "Dracula" was a favorite book of hers.

With this attention to literature and the written word generally (including the Irish Echo), she said, "it's no coincidence that my brother is a political science professor and I'm an English teacher."

McCormick-Lyons's paternal grandfather, a longshoreman, worked to keep alive the Irish traditions because he'd been orphaned by the death of his parents in the Spanish Flu

following World War I. (He resided in the institution that was at the center of the novel "Motherless Brooklyn.")

The family kept his memory alive, and were aware of the deaths of the great-grandparents and some of their children in the worldwide pandemic of the early 20th century.

The worldwide pandemic of the 21st century claimed McCormick-Lyons's mother Bernice, who died of Covid in 2020. Three months earlier her father John died from Alzheimer's disease.

"My dad worked for the U.S. Customs and belonged to the Emerald Society, and his brother, who worked for the Corrections Department, was a proud member of the Emerald Society – and that was always part of who we were and the tapestry of our family.

"My dad was so proud of my work as an English teacher and he was so proud of my work with labor, putting my fiery spirit to good use," she said.

"I grew up down the block from my uncles who were veterans and then postal workers after the war. We were surrounded by the importance of labor, our culture and our religion as well.

"As an Irish American I'm aware that struggle is part of our history. As an Irish Catholic, I've grown up with the spirit of social iustice and in doing what's right. And I know that the work of labor is the pathway of justice and what is right."

"As an Irish American I'm also aware that struggle is part of our history," she added. "As an Irish Catholic, I've grown up with the spirit of social justice and in doing what's right. And I know that the work of labor is the pathway of justice and what is right."

Ingrained was the view that organized labor "provided a stable path to the middle class for my family"; and connected to that is the belief that thanks to the labor movement "people can thrive and live well in this country"; and that "labor is part of the success story for Irish Americans."

McCormick-Lyons "History teaches us what happens when there aren't fair working conditions. And I'm just so thrilled about all unionization that's happening right now."

The causes of labor and of education intersect, McCormick-Lyons's view. "Everyone deserves a quality education, because opportunity."

How would the UFT Vice-President McCormick-Lyons make education better? students deserve schools that are fully funded, safe and rich with literature and experiences and that also provide the pathway to the skills and the trades," she said. "College isn't the only pathway forward. If we could connect towards success, if we could train students who are interested becoming electricians and getting unionized electrician jobs or becoming painters or carpenters, I think that would revolutionize education system."

However, teachers are under attack and education is constantly politicized. She said there is a PR campaign by people who want to end public education because an "educated populace is one that challenges those who are in

The former president, Donald Trump, and the governor of Florida, Ron DeSantis, are among those leading the campaign.

"I've been called a 'groomer' on Twitter," said McCormick-Lyons, who was raised in the Woodhaven and Middle Village in Queens. "I don't know what I'm grooming children for.

'Educators deserve to respected for the important work that we do," she said. "Our schools need to fully-funded centers of communities.'

For her, defending the cause of education and schools couldn't be more personal: her husband Michael is a public school teacher; while their children, Catherine Grace Lyons, 15, and Clare Elizabeth Lyons, 10, are public school students.

"Clare is named for the beautiful county," McCormick-Lyons who can boast roots in Roscommon, among other places in Ireland, and whose mother-in-law Knocknagoshel, Co. Kerry.

Not so long ago, her own mom asked, "Kara, are you going to go back to school?"

"No, but there's one program that I really want to do. It's called the Worker Institute at Cornell," she replied. "You have to be invited in and the NY State AFL-CIO sends people and our state union sends people."

"On the day of my mom's funeral, I received a text inviting me to participate in the Worker Institute, which I thought was a beautiful sign," she said.

On a recent trip to Montauk, McCormick-Lyons remembered that she'd brought her dad there and it was the last place he visited before he was too ill to vacation anymore. While thinking about that, she got an email telling her she would be honored at Friday night's Labor Awards.

"I felt again it was my parents" approval of this McCormick-Lyons said.
